The meeting of the McIntosh City Council was called to order by Mayor Toby Strom at 5:30 PM
Thursday June 11, 2026

1) Motion by Councilmember Hagen and seconded by Councilmember Syverson to approve the May 14, 2026, Regular Council meeting minutes. Carried

2) Poplar Meadows Committee member Boehrsen reported there are currently 25 residents at Poplar Meadows with three open apartments.

3) Motion by Councilmember Syverson and seconded by Councilmember Hagen to approve the submitted claims for Poplar Meadows for \$107,018.06. Carried.

4) The Poplar Meadows fee schedule for Mary and Vergil Lerfald was discussed. Motion by Councilmember Syverson and seconded by Councilmember Hagen to approve a service package better suited for the couple.

5) Council discussed getting quotes a new tractor for mowing and snow removal.

New Business

6) Motion by Councilmember Hagen and seconded by Councilmember Syverson to approve the building permit for Mathew Sandberg. Motion carried.

7) A water tower cleanout quote was offered by Maguire Iron. Motion by Councilmember Syverson to stay with our current water tower maintenance company, KLM, LLC. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Simonson and carried.

8) The City's animal ordinances were reviewed and changes to the citation process will be discussed with the City's attorney.

9) Motion by Councilmember Syverson and seconded by Councilmember Hagen to approve installing a privacy screen around the dumping station at Roholt Park, per the new Minnesota state guidelines, Motion carried.

10) Councilmember Syverson introduced a resolution to accept a donation from the Beito Foundation in the amount of \$2,000.00 for beautification purposes. All members voted in the affirmative.

11) Councilmember Hagen introduced a resolution to accept a donation from the Beito Foundation in the amount of \$500.00 for the July Fourth celebration. All members voted in the affirmative. The Let Freedom Ring organization will receive the funds on behalf of the City to put toward celebration expenses.

12) Motion by Councilmember Syverson and seconded by Councilmember Strutz to approve the building permit for Ambrose Anderson. Motion carried.

13) Motion by Councilmember Hagen to approve the City's claims in the amount of \$23,848.68 Motion seconded by Councilmember Simonson and carried.

14) Councilmember Syverson inquired about fixing potholes around town. Mayor Strom said he would ask for quotes from paving companies.

15) Mayor Strom has directed Peter Tranby to address the overgrown trees and shrubs in the City's parks.

16) Mosquito spraying will be scheduled for the weeks of June 22nd and June 29th.

17) Motion by Councilmember Syverson to approve a \$100.00 gift card from Bully Brew for David and Wanda Stordahl for their volunteer work in painting curbs. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Hagen and carried.

With no other business to discuss, a motion by Councilmember Hagen to adjourn the meeting at 6:47. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Simonson and carried.
